Curriculum and Assessment

Holland Elementary School utilizes high-quality, research-based curriculums that teach the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) and support student achievement.

We assess/monitor student progress at the beginning, middle, and end of the year using:

- PK: CIRCLE Progress Monitoring
- K-1: Texas Primary Reading Instrument(TPRI), Benchmark Assessment System(BAS), Texas Early Mathematics Inventories (TEMI)
- 2: Texas Primary Reading Instrument(TPRI), iReady, and Star (AR)
- 3-5: iReady, Star (AR), and STAAR (State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness)
