

Holland ISD is extremely happy to announce our 2022 district accountability results. In 2019, (last accountability rating) the district also had an A rating with a 93 scaled score, so our score of 94 continues to be an A and is an improvement. The perseverance from our staff and students throughout the last several years contributed to these scores. Teachers and staff tirelessly planned and invested in our students on a daily basis. Our first goal is to build relationships with our students so they know how much we care, therefore; the students are willing to work to meet the district's high expectations.

Holland ISD had a goal for at least 90% of the students to achieve at the Approaches level, 60% at the Meets grade level, and 30% at the masters level for all sub-populations. The District needed 2 more percent for the Approaches level to meet the goals. Each of the district categories also achieved at least a 90% score which is an improvement from a B in the category of Academic Growth from 2019. All campuses will continue to look at sub-populations scores and categories to determine where additional support is needed and how we as a District can improve.

Holland High school was within 4 points of earning all A's in the various categories. The Academic Growth category increased several points which is a positive. Last year, 47% of our Seniors attended Temple College and earned Dual Course credits paid for by Holland ISD and we will continue to promote this opportunity which will raise our College, Career, and Military Readiness category. Holland High School earned 5 of the 7 Distinctions that were available, intentional planning will be completed in the coming days to see how we need to go about earning the other 2 Distinctions.

Holland Middle school showed tremendous gains in multiple areas. All categories scored over 90 with an overall score of 93. The Middle School also earned all 7 "Distinction Designations" out of 7, an excellent achievement. In 2019, several categories were B's with the lowest in Academic Growth at 80 and this year it is 90.

Holland Elementary earned an overall score of 87 which is 2 points lower than 2019. Academic Growth was 8 points higher this year, but Closing the Gap category was 7 points lower. Currently, we have increased intervention during the school day using quality programming and have added intervention teachers to support this process.

As the Superintendent, I am extremely grateful for the hard work that our staff, parents, students and community members contribute on a daily basis to the educational process at Holland Independent School District. We will continue to strive toward excellence in every capacity to fulfill our mission for the students and their goals.
